Friends of Lower Haw is focusing this spring on advocating for Chatham County to spend American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds on Haw River corridor projects. Chatham County is receiving more than \$14 million in ARPA funds from the federal government to address needs specifically related to the COVID-19 pandemic. Eligible uses for ARPA funds are intended to address public health concerns, negative economic impacts, public sector capacity, and infrastructure needs in response to the pandemic. Advocates spoke at community engagement sessions and county commissioner meetings in support of spending ARPA funds on the Haw River corridor for land conservation, sustainable land and paddle trails, two infrastructure projects in the Lower Haw River State Natural Area, and an Open Space & Trails Coordinator. Other advocacy for the Lower Haw this year includes the Great Trails State Coalition (GTSC). The coalition is a broad-based group of diverse organizations, agencies and supporters advocating for increased state investment in all types of trails statewide.

GTSC recommends building upon North Carolina's trail legacy by investing in and expanding our state's current trail systems.

Historic Register Plaques Installed on Bynum Bridge

On April 23, 2020, Bynum Bridge was added to the National Register of Historic Places.

This success came after years of work spearheaded by Diane Swan and Debbie Tunnell. Early in 2021, they asked Jennifer Bosz of the N.C. Department of Natural and Cultural Resources how soon a National Register Historic plaque might be installed on the bridge. Ms Bosz informed them, "Purchase and installation of National Register plaques or signage is a private endeavor. National Register plaques are neither funded nor governed by NPS (National Park Service) nor the North Carolina State Historic Preservation Office."

Since NCDOT is the owner of the bridge, Mary Pope Furr (Historic Architecture Supervisor at NCDOT) was also notified of the request. In early August, Ms. Furr responded that she had forwarded the request to Tim Welch, NCDOT Division 8 Bridge Program Manager. Mr. Welch helped on the Historic application process. He consulted with upper management on the historic plaque installation, and after a few months reported regretfully, "The NCDOT will not be able to fund the placement of a historical plaque(s) on the Bynum Bridge. The requesting party would need to supply the plaque(s). The Department is willing to assist with installation." NCDOT provided wordage allowed and the name of a plaque company, Franklin Bronze Plaques in Franklin PA. Diane contacted Franklin Bronze to begin the process.



To measure, size, and figure out placement of a plaque at each end of the bridge (across from the original plaques), Tim Welch sent Tim Mabe (Division 8 Bridge Maintenance Supervisor). The plaque size and message were approved by Dean Garner, NCDOT Engineer and Bridge Maintenance Supervisor. To finance the \$777.40 cost of the plagues, a GoFundMe raised \$800 which covered fees and \$770.17 of the cost. Success!

Thanks to everyone who donated and made this happen just in time for Bynum Bridge's 100th birthday year!

The Bynum Bridge stands over the Haw River marking its importance as a "structure associated with events that have made a significant contribution to the broad patterns of our history and a bridge which embodies a distinctive method of construction that helped make North Carolina The Good Roads State." Right here in Bynum - beloved and honored.

The Bynum Bridge National Register Historic Plaques were installed on each end of Bynum Bridge on February 3, 2022 by Tim Mabe and Jake.

Bynum Front Porch Awarded Grant for Operational Support from the Mary Duke Biddle Foundation

Established in 1956, the Mary Duke Biddle Foundation (MDBF) works to encourage, promote, and nurture the arts and K-12 educational communities in North Carolina's Chatham, Durham, Orange, and Wake counties. The foundation believes the arts are essential to strong, vibrant communities and a dynamic cultural sector is a catalyst for growth, attracting and retaining businesses and visitors.

Beginning in 2021, MDBF shifted most of its grantmaking from project-based support to Operating Support for organizations aligned with its program funding goals. This includes support for cultural organizations that demonstrate artistic excellence and elevate the profile of the Triangle's arts scenes, both locally and nationally; new, emerging, or grassroots cultural organizations

that document, preserve, and/or present the values, spirit, and diversity of the Triangle's cultural community; and/or arts-focused organizations that work directly with artists to nurture the current and next generations of artists, help them deepen and expand their talent, develop their professional and business skills, and create new works.

Bynum Front Porch met the criteria to apply for this grant focusing on Operational Support to help get over the hump that the Covid pandemic created in 2020. (BFP had to cancel the Summer Series and other fundraising efforts.) We are very appreciative and honored that the Mary Duke Biddle Foundation found that Bynum Front Porch (a small grassroots organization, totally volunteer) deserved a \$5000 Grant.
