At our Annual Membership Meeting in September 2022, long time President Gretchen Smith reached her term limit and transitioned to her new role as Past President on the Board of Directors. Anne Geer was elected as our new President, Megan Lynch was elected as our new Vice President, and newly elected board members Daniel Cohen, Leah Purvis, Matt Spangler, and Reuben Wilson joined Secretary Catherine Deininger and Treasurer Sam Jackson on our Board of Directors. We appreciate the years of service of outgoing board members Ryan Cadwalader, Guil Johnson, and Jan Sherwin.

Our newest project is joining the ecoEXPLORE program by getting the Lower Haw River State Natural Area designated as an ecoEXPLORE HotSpot location. Developed by The North Carolina Arboretum, this program is an incentive-based citizen science program for children in grades K-8 that encourages outdoor exploration. Children can earn ecoEXPLORE badges and earn points that can be redeemed for field prizes by taking and submitting photographs of organisms. Participants can use their own device to

photograph their nature observations or check out an ecoEXPLORE Discovery Pack with equipment from the Chatham Community Library. We have installed an ecoEXPLORE sign at the US 15-501 kiosk and plan to install another sign at the US 64 kiosk.

We continue to focus on advocacy efforts for three major goals: active management of Lower Haw by State Parks and/or Chatham County; development of sustainable land and paddle trails; and expansion of Lower Haw and the Haw River Trail through land acquisition and easements. Our advocacy activities include presenting to local elected officials and county staff, cultivating partnerships with The Conservation Fund and Triangle Land Conservancy, and continuing our work with the Haw River Trail Steering Committee. In February we began working with Alta Planning + Design and the county's new Trails and Open Space Planner on the Haw River trail corridor feasibility study as part of a working group of the Haw River Trail Steering Committee. Expected to be completed by August, this project is funded by an EDA Travel, Tourism, and Outdoor Recreation grant to Triangle J Council of Governments on behalf of Chatham and Alamance counties.



We are excited about our partnership with the Great Trails State Coalition, a broad coalition of nonprofits, local governments, industry partners, and state agencies dedicated to advocating for more state funding for all types of trails in North Carolina. The coalition successfully lobbied the NC General Assembly to designate 2023 as the Year of the Trail in North Carolina. This statewide celebration marks the 50th anniversary of the 1973 North Carolina Trails System Act. Year of the Trail will showcase and promote all types of trails throughout our state with events and programming on television and radio as well as print and digital media. Friends of Lower Haw kicked off our Year of the Trail celebration with a First Day Outdoors Hike led by FLOHA board member Megan Lynch. We are planning more events throughout the year.

Friends of Lower Haw is thrilled about two bills introduced in the NC General Assembly to authorize the Haw River Trail as a State Trail. We have been advocating for this designation and have been working on it with Bill Holman, NC State Director of The Conservation Fund. SB 100 was introduced by Senator Amy Galey of Alamance County on February 14 and is also sponsored by

Senator Natalie Murdock of Chatham County. A companion bill, HB 124, was introduced by Representatives Stephen Ross and Dennis Riddell of Alamance County on February 15 and is also sponsored by Representative Robert Reives of Chatham County. Both bills have been referred to committee. We appreciate the support of these state legislators for the Haw River Trail, a concept for over 70 miles of land and paddle trails from Haw River State Park to Jordan Lake State Recreation Area. State Trail designation must be authorized by the NC General Assembly and signed by the Governor. In addition to giving a trail more status and marketing clout, this designation means the Department of Natural and Cultural Resources “shall support, promote, encourage, and facilitate the establishment of trail segments” and “the State may receive donations of appropriate land and may purchase other needed lands for the Haw River State Trail.” We are very grateful to Bill Holman for his role in working with state legislators to introduce these bills.

For now, the Outpost will only be open on weekends for rental of solo sit-on-top kayaks for self-guided paddle trips upriver from the Bynum dam and back down. You will be able to reserve dates and times by going to www.hawrivercanoe.com to our online reservation system. Later in the year, we hope to introduce guided natural history-oriented upriver trips and, if water levels allow, downriver guided trips.

As we begin our 41st year working to protect the 110 miles of the Haw River, we invite you to take a look back online at 40 years of memories: <https://hawriver.org/resources/publications/>.

In many ways the Haw is in better shape than it was 40 years ago but we're continuing to fight hard to get industrial chemicals like PFAS out of the Haw, and to watchdog new development construction for violations that cause muddy waters. We'll be starting up our weekly Swim Guide again this summer to let the public know if favorite swimming, tubing, and wading spots along the Haw River (including Bynum) have safe levels of E-coli. We post our sampling results on our social media each Friday, Memorial Day weekend through Labor Day. On March 18, we held our Clean-Up-A-Thon with teams cleaning up the Haw from Greensboro

to Jordan Lake. Thanks to everyone who joined in the effort here in Bynum – the picture is from the clean-up last year.

Just go to the Pittsboro Post Office, ask to see Peter or Solita and request a PO Box in Bynum. There will be a one-time charge of \$25 (for the new lock). When the boxes are all gone, the postmaster will consider opening more if there is interest. Let's get those boxes owned and all filled up so we can maintain the 27228 zip code and keep Bynum on the map!!!
